and as visiting lecturer in spirituality at Colgate/Rochester Divinity School-Bexley Hall-Crozier Theological Seminary.

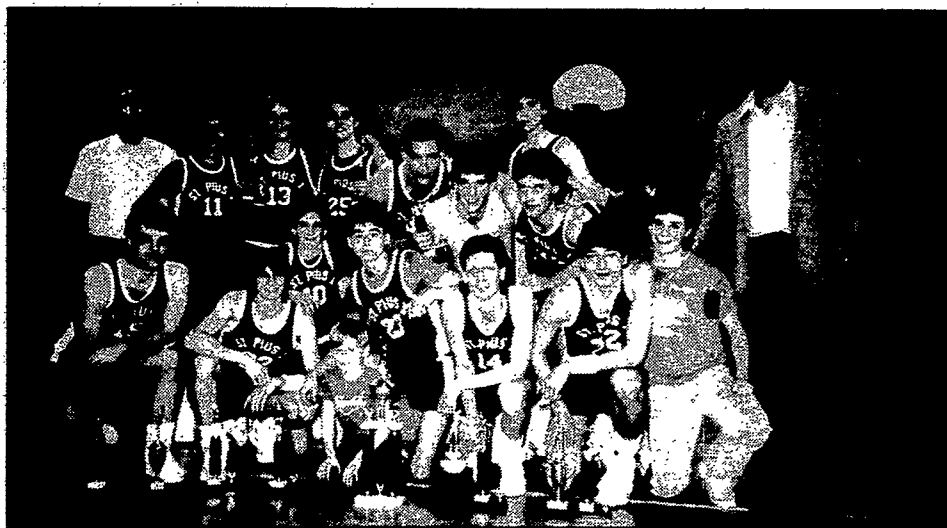
Although he has retired, Father Callens remains active at St. Louis Parish in Pittsford, where he particularly enjoys working with young people.
