

# Neighbors

Delegates to the General Chapter of the Rochester Sisters of St. Joseph have elected Sister Elizabeth Anne LeValley to a second four-year term as superior general of the congregation.



Elected as assistant superior general was Sister Rosemary St. Peter, who had previously served as counselor in the congregation's central administration.

Four councilors were also chosen. Sister Maura Wilson and Sister Agnes Catherine Battersby were elected to their second four-year terms. Sister Rita Jongen and Sister Mary Ann Mayer — both teachers at Nazareth Academy — were newly elected as councilors.

Bishop Matthew H. Clark presided over the elections, which were held during official sessions of the General Chapter, May 2 and 3.

A total of six teachers and principals have been chosen to serve on subcommittees of the Diocesan Personnel Commission. They are Salary and Benefits — Christopher Meagher, St. James School, Rochester, and Stephen Oberst, St. Pius Tenth; Development of Ministers/Employees — Peggy Clark, St. John the Evangelist School, Greece, and James Bell, Most Precious Blood; Comprehensive Policies — Carol Faso, Christ the King School, and Barbara Williams, St. Charles Borromeo.

Winners have been announced in the Catholic War Veterans' essay contest for Monroe County students. Margaret Yackiw of Sacred Heart School received a \$250 scholarship toward tuition at any Catholic high school for her first-place essay. St. Josephat student Melanie Sztanko received a \$100 savings bond for second place and Judith Mathews, a student at Good Shepherd School in Henrietta, earned third place and a \$50 savings bond.
