## Parish planning in evangelization program

**St. Mary, Elmira** — The parish is helping to orchestrate diocesan participation in Pentecost '87: National Celebration of Evangelization for the Catholic Laity, a one-day evangelization program being sponsored by the Paulist Fathers' National Catholic Evangelization Association.

Through a satellite/television network, Pentecost '87 is expected to bring together 60,000 Catholics in more than 200 locations across the nation for a seven-hour-long discussion of means of evangelizing the 75 million unchurched Americans and the 15 million inactive U.S. Catholics.

At Notre Dame High School, more than 200 members of the Diocese of Rochester will gather for this event Saturday, June 6. Seats are still available, but registration is required. For information, contact Linda Savino-Riker at (607)734-6254.

Our familiarity with the readings of Pentecost may tempt us to give them little heed as we celebrate this feast. Their richness, however, should not be taken lightly. In the Gospel, John reflects the power of the resurrection by placing the Pentecost event on the evening of the first day of the week. He makes an intimate connection between new life and the exuberance of the Spirit whose gift is peace. As our Easter season comes to a close, we are scripturally transported back to the beginning by this Gospel.

The Acts of the Apostles tell of the coming of the Holy Spirit in the mystical signs of fire, wind, motion and tongues. It is exciting

to see the apostles filled with this Spirit and totally renewed! This same Spirit is received by all Christians. During this past Easter Season, our diocese has celebrated ordinations and confirmations — sacraments that call upon the Spirit for consecration and guidance.

In the second reading, St. Paul reminds the listener that the gifts are different gifts but the Spirit is the same. His metaphor of the human body gives a graphic example of the way the baptized community works together. The challenge of Pentecost is to continue working in the vision of Christ. It is through the Spirit that we learn to recognize each others' gifts without being threatened or jealous. We recognize all members of the body as being important. Indeed, during this completed Lent-Easter season, *Crossroads* has focused on the dignity of the baptized — the common faith shared by all who believe in Christ and make this commitment formal through the waters of initiation. It has been an opportunity for us, as a diocesan Church, to focus our attention on the whole body professing its belief in Jesus Christ. To

maintain our common dignity, we are one body — all necessary to make the whole.

With the feast of Pentecost, we conclude the Easter season and begin ordinary time. The readings of ordinary time relate the story of Jesus in his public ministry. The "high points" of the Paschal Mystery — Jesus' death and resurrection — create the foundation for the ministry of Jesus and for the continuation of that ministry through the Church. As we enter ordinary time, we reflect on our routine lives, attempting to make the ordinary extraordinary, because the Spirit has empowered us through our baptisms. Easter gives us a vision and brings us in touch with our roots. Ordinary time allows us to nourish these precious roots, so

that Christianity may grow and our lives may blossom into the fullness of life with God.

Pentecost also signals the beginning of the Marian Year. In our diocese, Bishop Matthew H. Clark will inaugurate this year by praying the rosary with Monsignor Cirrione on the "Family Rosary for Peace" broadcast of Sunday, June 7. This nightly rosary, which airs at 6:30 p.m. on WSWG-AM1460, is a good way to commemorate the Marian Year by inviting your family to pray it together. Pope John Paul II will lead the rosary on a television special entitled "Prayer for World Peace," which will be broadcast by New York City station WPIX (channel 11 on Greater Rochester Cablevision) at noon on Saturday, June 6.

Please pray that this Marian Year will be a time of grace for both our diocesan and universal churches.
