Speaker urges Congress to boost funding for private-school students

Washington (NC) — Private school students too often "are treated as orphans when it comes to sharing in the benefits of federal assistance," a U.S. Catholic Conference official testified recently before a congressional subcommittee.

Father Thomas G. Gallagher, USCC education secretary, urged Congress to restore the level and quality of participation of private school children in the Chapter I educational assistance program.

"Too often our high school students are treated as orphans when it comes to sharing in the benefits of federal assistance. Many of our high school students, particularly in our inner cities, are in need of supplemental educational programs," Father Gallagher said in the May 7 testimony.

Testifying before the Senate Subcommittee on Education, Arts and Humanities, Father Gallagher said that for more than 20 years the Chapter I program, formerly known as Title I, helped millions of educationally disadvantaged students in both public and private schools by providing them with special educational services.

Private school students are still eligible for remedial aid under Chapter I, but in 1985 the Supreme Court ruled that public school teachers may not provide the remedial instruction in parochial school classrooms.

Since the court decision Catholic officials and educators repeatedly have called for ways to make sure parochial school students receive remedial-aid benefits to which they are legally entitled.

Some parochial-school students have been receiving remedial instruction in public schools, some attend classes at neutral sites and many have stopped receiving the service. "These alternatives have proven to be

particularly disruptive to the regular academic program of these needy students," Father Gallagher said. "Need we point out that these are the very children who can least afford to lose precious instructional time?"

Mobile vans for classes or computer instruction greatly reduce the disruption to the child's regular education programs, he said, but the increased costs of the alternative delivery methods "may seriously erode the funding available for actual instructional services for both public and private school children."

These increases are further compounded by a decline in the quality of instruction within the Chapter I program for private-school children, according to Father Gallagher.

To restore the level and quality of participation he urged that new funds be allocated for the Chapter I program and that local educational agencies be required to use the additional funds only for new alternative delivery systems, such as mobile units, buses and computer equipment.

"This special funding could go a long way toward overcoming the reluctance on the part of some public-school authorities toward implementing these new alternative methods or providing services to private school children," Father Gallagher said.

He also endorsed a proposal to provide local educational agencies the option to award compensatory education certificates to parents of Chapter I students.

This is in keeping "with the intent of Congress, to afford them greater flexibility and discretion in decision-making," he said.
