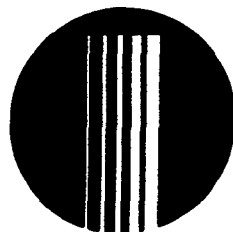

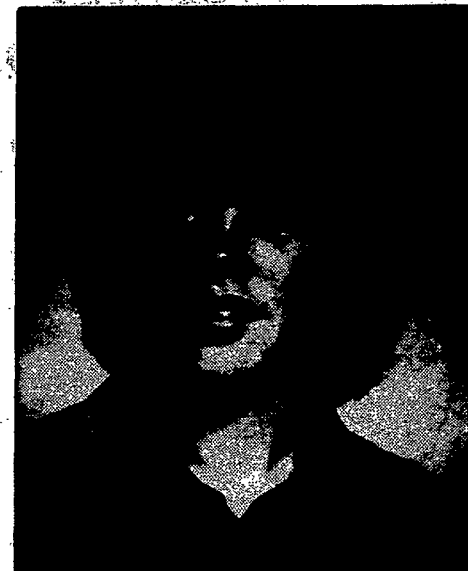

"Very rarely now do you see a student majoring in computer science," said Farrell, who added that 83 percent of Kearney seniors will be going to college. "But around here you always see students interested in engineering. Students reflect the attitude of their parents at this age level, and many parents in this community have backgrounds in engineering."

Farrell said that most students from Kearney feel "academically comfortable and prepared" when they leave, but they have a rough time dealing with dorm life as opposed to home life.

"The ones who have the easiest times are the ones who get valuable experience from

their families and friends," Farrell. "That gives them a sense of what they're getting into."

That sense of family is especially important at Notre Dame High School in Elmira, which demonstrates that class size doesn't make a difference in the percentage of students who will seek higher learning.

At Notre Dame, 98 percent of the 103 graduates will be going on to college, whether it be a two-year or four-year institution.

Corning Community, Niagara and Siena colleges have become popular choices for Notre Dame students, who, like many students at the larger Catholic secondary schools in the diocese, frequently get an early start on college by taking AP courses in such areas as English, chemistry and calculus.
