ball. "We don't really have the college teams to support... like a Syracuse. And because there's not a real dominant college team, the focus is on the high school level." He went on to cite the high school basketball programs at East, McQuaid, Cardinal Mooney and Fairport as some examples of teams that receive "college-like" attention.

Under the current statewide format, more than 800 schools compete to determine sectional champions. After those are de-

ceded, four regional champions in four classes — A, B, C, and D — advance to the state tournament. Section 5 champions play in the Western Regionals against Section 6 (Buffalo area) opponents.

The NYSPHSAA tournament was brought back in 1978 after a 45-year hiatus, and was awarded to the Rochester locations for three years. More than 16,000 fans attended 18 games at six Rochester-area sites during the tourney's first year back. Since 1980, the annual tournament has undergone several changes in its format.

A decision is still pending on the annual Federation Tournament, which has taken place in Glens Falls the weekend after the public high school tournament.

games, where the weaker team holds on to the ball the entire game. I would be in favor of that (a shot clock)."

The three-point shot will also call for changes in the traditional head work of high school basketball coaches.

"It's going to force all coaches to rethink game plans, especially at the end of the game," Marchese said. "It will be interesting to see how coaches approach that."

The new shot will no doubt wreak havoc defensively.

"A lot of teams will have to play man-to-man (defense) or extend their zone," Marchese said.

The Knight coach is already anxious to use the shot even in these sweltering summer months well before the early-December start of the high school basketball season.

"We're definitely going to work it into our offense; I think you have to keep it a regular part of your offense," the Knight coach said. "And it forces coaches to look at the three-point shot philosophically."

"You only have to be successful with it, say, 50 percent of the time, where from the two-point range you have to be successful 60 percent of the time."
