

Diocesan Appointments

Schools set policies for free, reduced meals

The Catholic Schools Office of the Diocese of Rochester has announced its free and reduced-price meal (free milk) policy for students in 17 diocesan schools. Schools covered by the policy are: Blessed Sacrament Junior High; Guardian Angels; Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Brockport; Our Lady Queen of Peace; St. Ann, Hornell; St. Agnes, Avon; St. James, Waverly; St. Joseph, Wayland; St. Lawrence; St. Mary, Canandaigua; St. Margaret Mary; St. Michael, Penn Yan; St. Patrick, Owego; St. Patrick, Seneca Falls; St. Stanislaus; St. Stephen/St. Francis, Geneva; and St. Theodore.

Similar policies also were announced by Our Lady of Mercy High School and Notre Dame High School, Elmira.

Each of the three policies sets specific eligibility criteria based upon income and family size. These eligibility figures are available from the schools and the diocesan education office. Application forms have been sent to parents

of children in the covered schools. Additional forms are available in the principal's office of each school. The forms may be submitted at any time during the school year.

Changes in family income or size will necessitate re-application. Moreover, the schools have the right at any time to verify information provided by families. This information will be used only to determine eligibility and will be kept strictly confidential.

Families whose applications are denied may requested hearings or conferences with school officials. No child will be discriminated against because of his race, sex, color, national origin, age or handicap. Furthermore, no identification or discrimination will take place regarding any student participating in the free/reduced-price meal program.

MCC hosting exhibit of holocaust artifacts

Auschwitz: A Crime Against Mankind, an exhibition of Holocaust artifacts and documents provided by the Auschwitz State Museum in Poland, will be on display at Monroe Community College through September 17. The exhibit will be open to the public Monday through Thursday, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m., and Friday through Sunday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in MCC's Physical Education Complex (Building 10).

The exhibition is under the national sponsorship of the United Jewish Appeal. The Jewish Community Federation of Rochester, Inc., and Monroe Community College are the Rochester sponsors. The exhibition was produced by the International Auschwitz Committee for the State Museum in Poland, and is currently on a two-year tour of 15 major U.S. cities. Aside from being shown at the United Nations, Rochester is the only city within New York state

to host the exhibit.

Auschwitz: A Crime Against Mankind traces the history of the Nazi concentration and death camp from its 1940 construction through the liberation of survivors by the Allies in 1945. Included are 135 panels of photographs, documents, artwork, personal belongings and more.

Among the artworks are 17 pen-and-ink drawings by Mieczyslaw Koscielniak and two oak-wood sculptures by Witold Werndl.

There is no admission charge for the exhibition; Building 10 is also wheelchair accessible. Special assistance for the hearing impaired (interpreters, loop and FM systems) can be arranged by calling 271-5484.
