McQueen believes the parish's latest effort is much like its previous attempt to help those in need.

"We're very concerned about the nutritional needs of mothers and children," she observed. "Obviously this is consistent with what we did with the people in Ethiopia. It's definitely a parallel situation."


Father Nadolny, who has since taken on additional projects of his own — including helping put two wells on a seminary property in Ethiopia as well as supplying water for an orphanage in the northern tip of the country — said he will remain committed to helping relieve famine in Africa.

"There is no reason for anybody to starve to death anywhere," said Father Nadolny, who is also directing his labor toward Haiti. "In Haiti, one-third of the children don't reach their fifth year, and one-fifth die at birth."

Statistics like those frustrate the priest even as he continues to help those in their struggle against poverty.

"There has never really been a war on poverty in the world; the world does not have to starve," he said, adding that the arms race is a direct attack on the poor. "My goal is to raise the consciousness of the parish family so they see the needs of God's global family."
