Fair offers holiday alternatives

St. Mary Our Mother, Horseheads — The social ministry committee will host a Harvest Dinner and Alternative Christmas Idea Fair Saturday, Nov. 14, from 5-7 p.m. in the auditorium and gymnasium.

The fair will feature information about how the celebration of Christmas can be good news for the poor, both locally and throughout the world. Organizations will offer cards and gifts crafted by families in Third-World countries, as well as details about how to send such families a "gift of life." Also available will be suggestions for simple, creative gifts which children can make.

Before or after they shop, browsers can enjoy a turkey dinner, the proceeds from which will be used to help feed local families who are hungry. Dinners will be \$3.50 for adults and children aged 12 or older; \$2.50 for senior citizens; and \$2 for children aged five to 11. Preschool children will be charged a penny per pound.
