Rochester rivalry

A new NCAA football rivalry could be brewing as a result of an agreement made last week between two Rochester-area football teams.

St. John Fisher's Cardinals, completing their first season of Division III college football, have entered into a three-year agreement to play the University of Rochester's Yellowjackets starting in 1989. The teams will meet the first two years at UR and the third year at Fisher.

Fisher Athletic Director Bob Ward said the game should prove a good drawing card for Rochester-area grid fans.

"I think it's a game Rochester would like to see," Ward said. "We're really the only school in the Rochester area which could be a good game four or five years down the road for the U of R. I'm sure they look at it that way, too."

The Cardinals, who have also lined up such other rugged Division III opponents as Cortland and Gallaudet College, should benefit from the arrangement, head coach Ralph Gebhardt said.

"It should help in a few areas, mainly in recruiting," Gebhardt said. "With the num-

ber of local kids, it should turn into a rivalry, albeit a good-natured rivalry."

The tougher schedule should prove a formidable challenge for Gebhardt and Fisher, who hope to field a competitive team when the games against the Yellowjackets begin.

Fisher also announced last week that it will join a new Division III football league to be known as the Atlantic Collegiate Football Conference.

Joining the Cardinals will be Gallaudet in Washington, D.C., Brooklyn College, the State University of New York Maritime College in the Bronx, and Siena College in Loudonville. The league will begin play next year.

Apparently two or three teams will be added next month. This year Fisher has defeated Siena twice and Maritime and Brooklyn once each.
