

#### Liturgy to highlight Bishop Clark's jubilee

A special liturgy at Sacred Heart Cathedral, 296 Flower City Park, Rochester on Saturday, Dec. 19, will highlight the diocesan celebration of Bishop Matthew H. Clark's 25th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood.

The liturgy will be followed by a social hour at the cathedral. A jubilee reception at Our Lady of Mercy High School, 1437 Blossom Road, Rochester, will follow from 2:30 to 4:30 p.m.

The reception will feature an informal musical tribute to Bishop Clark by the Clark Caroleers, a singing group comprising people throughout the diocese whose names are Clark. Our Lady of Lourdes' Bell Chorus will also participate in the musical tribute.

All of these events are open to the public. A native of Waterford, N.Y., Bishop Clark was ordained a priest of the Albany diocese by Bishop Martin O'Connor on December 19, 1962 in Rome.

During his early years in the priesthood, Bishop Clark served in a number of pastoral and administrative positions within his home dincese

In 1974, the bishop went to Rome to become spiritual director of the North American College, a position he held until his ordination as bishop in May, 1979.

He was installed as Rochester's eighth bishop on June 26, 1979.

#### Teenagers sell fruit baskets

Northern Cayuga Cluster — Members of the confirmation class and the senior-high Reality Group are once again preparing Christmas fruit baskets for sale.

The baskets, which are available in two sizes, cost \$6 or \$8, and may be purchased as gifts or donated to members of the cluster community who are ill or housebound.
