Father Patrick C. McCarthy killed in New Orleans

Former Rochesterian Father Patrick C. McCarthy, a priest of the Society of St. Joseph, was found dead in his New Orleans rectory on Friday, December 18. New Orleans police have charged one man with assault and are seeking a second suspect.

Father McCarthy had served as pastor of Blessed Sacrament Church, in New Orleans, since October 3. He was chairman of the department of religion at St. Augustine High School. The 37-year-old priest was ordained in Washington, D.C., in 1982 and had been a faculty member of St. Augustine High since then.

Born in Rochester in 1950, he was one of three children born to the late Edward McCarthy, an attorney, and Rita Conley McCarthy. He attended St. Anne's School, Monroe High and Monroe Community College, all in Roch-

ester. He later received a degree in psychiatric social work from Rochester Institute of Technology in 1976.

After working as a parish assistant at St. Paul of the Cross Church in Honeyoye Falls, Father McCarthy decided to study for the priesthood and entered the Josephite House of Studies in New Orleans. He received a master of arts degree from the Washington Theological Union in the District of Columbia in 1982 and was ordained in Washington in May of 1982. While a deacon, he served as counselor in the guidance department of Mackin Catholic High School in Washington, D.C., and was principal of the summer program at Holy Redeemer School in Washington, a remedial school for failing pupils. A gifted musician, he was organist and choir director at St. Joseph's Seminary while a student.

A concelebrated Mass of the Resurrection

was offered at Blessed Sacrament Church in New Orleans on Sunday, December 20, with a second Mass of Christian burial taking place on Monday, December 21, at Corpus Christi Church, New Orleans. Archbishop Philip M. Hannan, D.D., and the Very Rev. Eugene P. McManus, Superior General of the Josephite Fathers and Brothers were chief concelebrants. Rev. Peter C. Weiss, S.S.J., pastor of St. Theresa Church, Crowley, La., gave the funeral homily. Burial was at the St. Louis III Cemetery in the city.

A memorial service for Rochester-area friends and relatives was conducted Thursday, December 24, at St. Helen's Church.

Father McCarthy is survived by his mother, Rita McCarthy; brother and sister-in-law, Brian and Patricia McCarthy; sister, Mary Ann McCarthy; an aunt and uncle; nieces and cousins.

Scipio-Center resident Francis J. McGarry, active in various Church, community activities

Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated for Francis J. McGarry of Scipio Center on Wednesday, Dec. 9, 1987. The Mass was concelebrated by Father Robert J. Downs, pastor of St. Bernard's in Scipio Center, and Fathers Robert M. Egan, Daniel V. Hogan and William Spilly.

Mr. McGarry died Saturday, Dec. 5, 1987, after a year-long illness. He was 64.

A lifelong resident of Scipio and parishioner of St. Bernard's in Scipio Center, Mr. McGarry was active in activities of the church, where he served as auditor, trustee and president of the Holy Name Society.

His other religious affiliations included membership in the Knights of Columbus, the former Cayuga County Catholic School Board, the Mercy Hospital Advisory Board and the Mt. Carmel Men's Club.

Mr. McGarry was re-elected this past November to his third term as Republican

legislator in Cayuga County, representing the towns of Scipio and Fleming. He was associated with the National Bank of Auburn for 40 years until he retired as senior vice president and cashier in 1982. Mr. McGarry was a veteran of World War II.

An active member of many community and other organizations, Mr. McGarry was involved with the Scipio Volunteer Fire Department, March of Dimes, Cayuga Home for Children, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Auburn Community Chest, Auburn Chamber of Commerce and many bank associations.

His survivors include his wife, Elizabeth J. Nolan McGarry; three sons, J. Daniel of Genoa, William F. of Scipio and Timothy D. McGarry of Port Charlotte, Fla.; two granddaughters, Nicole and Amanda McGarry; and two grandsons, Joshua and Matthew McGarry.

Interment was at St. Bernard's Cemetery.
