nity about it," explained Mike Cymbala, a member of GIA's editorial staff. "There was nothing for the black community before, and suddenly there there appears a book that incorporates many of their musical traditions. It's given a black identity to Catholic worship."

Cymbala also noted that the company is selling far more single copies than is normal for a hymnal. "What we're finding is that many people are using it as a prayer book," he said. 'They're buying it and taking it home"

Dobson acknowledged that sales figures for the hymnal in the Rochester area are low at this time, but predicted that more parishes will begin to use Lead Me, Guide Me when they

The Martin Luther King Greater Rochester Divinity School will sponsor an interfaith worship service honoring Dr. Martin Luther King on Monday, Jan. 18, from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. at the Rochester Riverside Convention Center.

Highlights of the service include the main address by Dr. Robert Franklin, dean of Black Church Studies at Colgate Rochester Divinity School; a procession of teen diplomats representing various religious and cultural traditions; gospel music performed by the Martin Luther King Greater Rochester Community Gospel Choir; and a live telecast of the first hour of worship by WXXI-TV.
