**Nazareth news**

Tiny Wolfley, whose fine all-around play also contributed to the success of the volleyball team, was among six players chosen as first team GTE District 1 Academic All-

Americans by the College Sports Information Directors of America.

To be eligible for this honor, which combines athletic and academic excellence, a student-athlete must possess a cumulative grade-point average of at least 3.2 on a scale of 4.0.

A 5-foot-4 senior from Alexander, N.Y., Wolfley carries a 3.9 GPA as an accounting major with a minor in computer science. She has earned a variety of academic accolades, including the Nazareth College Scholarship. Wolfley is also a member of the National Association of Accountants and the Nazareth Business Organization, and has been named to the college's dean's list six times.

On the volleyball court, Wolfley was a starter in all 50 of Nazareth's games this season, serving up 56 aces while committing only 56 hitting errors in 340 attempts. In her

three seasons as a starter, the Golden Flyers have posted an impressive record of 106-43-1.

She is the sixth Nazareth student athlete to receive Academic All-America honors. Dave Adams, a 1,000-point scorer in basketball, and Chris Cataldo, a state champion in tennis, were named during the 1982-83 academic year. Soccer star Liz O'Leary and basketball standout Chris McCaffrey were each honored in 1985. McCaffrey was honored again last year as was volleyball player Michele Rupert.

Nazareth College senior Mary Kay Botsford and sophomore Megan McGrath were recently selected to the NCAA Division III Northeast Regional all-star team in women's volleyball. The team was chosen by the American Volleyball Coaches Association.

Botsford, a native of Ontario and a graduate of Wayne Central, and McGrath, a Medina native, were two of 12 players from New York, New Jersey and Delaware to be named to the all-star team. They were key performers this fall for the Golden Flyers, who finished 33-16-1 and won four tournaments, including the ECAC Upstate Tournament at Rhode Island College in Providence in November.

A three-year starter for Nazareth at middle hitter, Botsford led the team in digs with 108 and blocks with 132. She also contributed 153 kills and 45 assists. In the four seasons she played for the Golden Flyers, Nazareth had a record of 145-48-1.

In her first season as a Nazareth starter, McGrath led the Golden Flyers as a middle hitter in kills with 227 and service aces with 71. She also added 65 digs and 119 blocks.

St. Joseph's Villa is a non-profit agency that provides comprehensive mental health support services to children, adolescents and families.

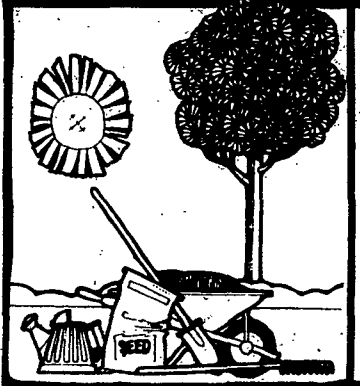

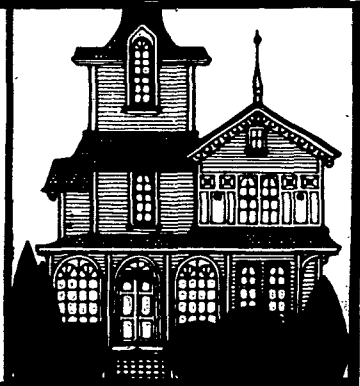
