Wrestling coach turns raw talent into champions

McQuaid grapplers win despite having little experience

Many of those who have wrestled at McQuaid Jesuit High School since John Roselli became head coach 23 years ago had never wrestled a single match before stepping through the private school's doors.

That's OK, their coach hadn't either. In fact, Roselli, who has guided the Knight grapplers since 1964, has never wrestled at all, neither while he attended McQuaid Jesuit High School nor at St. John Fisher College.

Yet his Knights have consistently had one of the best programs year after year.

"Our kids are really, really dedicated," said Roselli, who did play football at McQuaid (Class of '60) and basketball at Fisher ('64). They come into a winning program and work hard to keep it that way. It's a credit to them that, in two or three years, they can compete with public high schools that have junior-high. programs."

Having little or no experience on the mats hasn't stopped the Knights from pinning an opponent or two along the way. Since 1975, when Catholic schools became eligible to compete in the sectionals, the Knights as a team have finished runner-up three times.

Last year's grapplers, who were 14-0 in dual meets and ended the season ranked No. 13 in the state, were a breed apart. Not one to schedule easy matches, Roselli's Knights saw seven of the section's top 10 teams last year. Rob Wilson was a state qualifier in the 119-pound class after finishing runner-up in the sectionals, and Shawn Costello was the Section 5 champion

John Lama and Dan Gutkowski are also gone from last year's team. Lama placed third in the sectionals at 167 pounds, and Gutkowski was a 20-match winner at 177 and heavyweight.

And although inexperience has haunted McQuaid (7-4) in several losses this season, Roselli again has some of the best in the

Ed Porto (126 pounds), Chris Passero (119 pounds), Jeff Knauss (132 pounds) and Paul Roselli (145-155 pounds) are all among the top wrestlers in their weight divisions.

Porto is a cinch to win 20 matches and Passero (20-2) was a sectional champ last year. Undefeated in dual matches this season, Passero beat Canandaigua's Kerry Foster, 4-2, on Saturday, Jan. 30, marking the first time Foster (22-1) tasted defeat this season. The host Braves defeated the Knights, 37-21.

Knauss is 18-4 for the season, and Roselli's son, Paul, has compiled an impressive 21-2-1 record despite wrestling in two different weight divisions.

The season has not been free of adversity, either. Shannon Costello went down to an in-

jury during the Hilton Tournament on January 14. He may be able to return for the sectionals, giving the Knights a shot at another individual title.

Winning the Section 5 team championship may be out of reach for the Knights, who must get by the likes of Spencerport and Brighton. The two teams are ranked sixth and seventh in the state, respectively.

We've lost a couple of close matches and we've had some injuries, but I've been very pleased with these kids," Roselli said. "And if Shannon comes back, we could have two or three sectional champions."
