Hilton Knights plan brunch

Shroud researcher to give talk

Guardian Angels, Henrietta — Dr. Harry Gove, professor of physics and astronomy at the University of Rochester, will be the guest speaker at an adult-education program the parish is conducting on Sunday, Feb. 14.

Dr. Gove and his colleagues at UR were until last month among seven research teams designated by the Vatican to conduct scientific tests designed to determine the age of the Shroud of Turin, long believed to be the burial cloth of Christ. He also participated in a 1978 research project during which scientists conducted preliminary tests on the shroud.

Recently, however, Dr. Gove announced that the Vatican had narrowed the list of approved research facilities, eliminating UR from current consideration.

During the Guardian Angels presentation, the professor will discuss the findings of studies conducted to date. The public is invited to attend his presentation, which will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the church, 2061 E. Henrietta Road.
