Hornell native Father James T. Mooney, parochial vicar at Greece church

Father James T. Mooney, 36, parochial vicar at St. Charles Borromeo Church in Greece, died of cancer Monday, Feb. 22, 1988, in Highland Hospital.



A native of Hornell, Father Mooney attended St. Ann's School and Hornell High School. After earning an associate's degree from Corning Community College, Father Mooney received his bachelor's degree in speech and drama from Alfred University in 1974, and subsequently a earned master's degree in education from Elmira College in 1980.

Prior to entering Immaculate Conception Seminary in Huntington, N.Y., he worked for five years as assistant director of special services for the Division of Student Affairs at Alfred State College.

In 1986, Father Mooney received a master of divinity degree from Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.

Father Mooney was ordained to the diaconate by Bishop Matthew H. Clark at Sa-

cred Heart Cathedral on June 6, 1986. After then-Deacon Mooney had completed his deacon internship at St. Andrew's Church, Rochester, Bishop Clark ordained him to the priesthood in ceremonies at St. Andrew's on May 15, 1987.

In addition to his deaconal assignment, Father Mooney also had pastoral experience stemming from a one-year chaplaincy assignment with the National Institutes of Health, Bethesda, Md., and a summer of clinical duty at the State Psychiatric Center in Central Is-

lip, N.Y.

Father Mooney is survived by his father, Joseph K. Mooney; four sisters — Rita White and Kathleen Roselli of Hornell, Mary Jo Smith of Altoona, Pa., and Anne Bentley of Lakehurst, N.J.; several nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by his mother, Mary Theresa Mooney.

Bishop Joseph L. Hogan is scheduled to preside at the Mass of Christ the High Priest on Thursday, Feb. 25, at St. Ann's Church, Hornell. Father Emmett J. Halloran, pastor

of St. Charles Borromeo, is slated to give the homily for the 8 p.m. Mass.

The Mass of Christian Burial is scheduled for 10:30 a.m. Friday, Feb. 26, also at St. Ann's Church. Bishop Matthew H. Clark will preside, and the homily will be given by Father Ronald W. Stacey, pastor of St. Andrew's Church. Interment will be in St. Mary's Cemetery.

abortion is their only choice because there is no one to care for their unborn child," he said.

After the homily, Bishops Clark and Burrell, the Revs. Johnson, Elliott and Gonzalez, and Rabbi Cohen-Rosenberg each said a brief prayer of healing. The congregation was then invited to come to the front of the church to receive individual blessings and prayers.

Bishop Clark embraced everyone who came to him and offered each a few words of prayer and comfort.

Some people approached the front of the church alone; others went up as couples. A number of people were visibly attempting to hold back tears, and several cried openly.

Paul — who asked that his last name not be used — agreed that Bishop Clark's presence had a powerful affect on the people attending the service, particularly among the gay Catholics. The president of Dignity-Integrity — a group that ministers to gay Catholics and Episcopalians — Paul said group members who attended the service "felt particularly moved that Bishop Clark was there. It was such a positive sign for us because we've had so much oppression from the Church in general!"

According to Paul, people felt a sense of

healing and reconciliation at the service. "People felt comforted, supported and affirmed through both evenings," he said.

"It's wonderful that this has happened, but we should have been having a service like this much sooner," Paul remarked. "People need support and it's important that we (get) support from our churches?"

The religious support provided by the two services will continue, the Rev. Elliott said, noting that similar services will be celebrated on an annual basis. "There's going to be an increasing need for support over the next few years until a cure for AIDS can be found and the thing is stopped," she said.
