stone Hill without finds, during the next 55 years he succeeded in building up and paying for a whole city of charities. In 1926 he had the joy of dedicating there the splendid basilica of Our Lady of Victory. It was his thankyou gift for Mary's constant assistance.

Notable among the many philanthropies of the Baker cluster were its projects for orphans and for unwed mothers. Some of the orphans later settled in Corning and elsewhere in the Rochester diocese. The protectory was finally closed in 1956, but it had meanwhile served as foster parent to 100,000 children.

Although their life there had been hardy, its alumni remained loyal to their Lackawanna home. As one of them confessed two years ago, "We didn't like the place much then, but we wouldn't be alive today if it wasn't for Father Baker?

The program for unwed mothers remains active, providing all necessary physical and psychological care. Another related agency arranges for the adoption of the babies, if the mothers choose that course.

As Nelson Baker continued to expand and administer all these charitable institutions, he became revered for his pastoral leadership. He was a great promoter of eucharistic piety, and it was he above all who made the Parisian devotion to Our Lady of Victory better known

across the United States. Furthermore, when Father Baker was around, marvelous things that seemed beyond purely human powers sometimes occurred.

Corning Catholics were not surprised to hear reports of cures and other wonders at Lackawanna. The same sort of thing had happened when the padre was stationed at St. Mary's. At least three cures were attributed to him during his short stay in Corning. Sister Raymond Joseph Griffin, RSM, now the pastoral assistant at St. Vincent De Paul Church and herself a native of St. Mary's Parish, is looking into these local occurrences.

One of the alleged Corning cures was that of Katherine Dwyer. At the age of about 19, Kate contracted typhoid fever, but she made a quick recovery after Father Baker prayed over her and sprinkled her with water from the miraculous shrine at Lourdes, France.

The reported Corning cures cannot be scientifically verified at this late date. What is significant is that the parishioners of St. Mary's, after knowing the little Buffalo priest for only a few months, should have been so impressed by his spirituality that they were ready to accept him as a miracle-worker. No other priest assigned to St. Mary's has ever been held in quite the same spiritual esteem.

It is good, then, that in the Rochester diocese, the drive for the canonization of this "Padre of the Poor" should begin in Corning. The story of his career there, brief though it was, may give strong support to the proposition that he was indeed a saint.


