

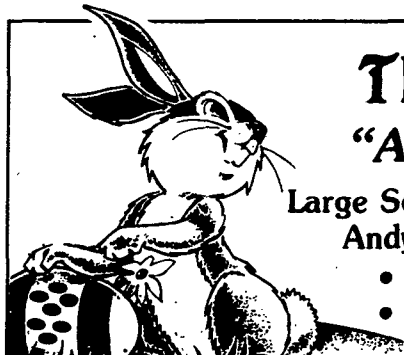

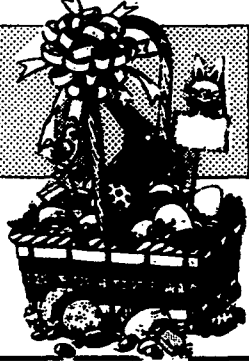

Choral concert announced

Holy Cross, Rochester — The parish's adult choir will perform a concert of sacred choral music on Friday, March 25, at 8 p.m. in the church, 4492 Lake Ave.

The program will consist of a progression of pieces that reflect on the Passion and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. The "Stabat Mater" of Josef Rheinberger will be the featured work, along with music of Bach, Schubert, Franck, Tchaikowsky and Handel. The choir will be accompanied by organist Paul Barte and a chamber orchestra, all conducted by John Gaspar.

Sister parish Mass scheduled

Corpus Christi, Rochester — A Mass honoring the memory of Archbishop Oscar Romero and marking the parish's decision to become a sister parish to the Christian community at Santa Marta, El Salvador, will be celebrated at Corpus Christi Church, 864 E. Main St., Thursday, March 24, at 7 p.m.

At weekend Masses March 12-13, the parishioners of Corpus Christi Church voted 295 to 6 to enter the sister parish relationship. The decision commits Corpus Christi to: raising material support for Santa Marta; sending delegations of parishioners to establish personal contact, see and hear the need of the people and deliver material support; maintaining regular communication with Santa Marta; responding to emergency situations in Santa Marta; and sharing community's experiences with other religious and secular groups.

People attending the service are requested to bring a photo or a similar symbol of themselves to be put in a scrapbook that will be sent to Santa Marta.

Neighbors

Two members of the Bishop Kearney High School Class of 1968 have been appointed superiors of religious communities.

Brother Kirk A. Phelps, CFC, is the new superior of the brothers' community at Iona Preparatory School, New Rochelle. Brother Phelps entered the Christian Brothers upon graduating from Bishop Kearney. A graduate of Iona College, he began his teaching career at Rice High School in New York City. He returned to Bishop Kearney for the 1974/75 school year, then taught at Essex Catholic High School in Newark, N.J., and Monsignor Farrell High School on Staten Island. He currently teaches science and mathematics at Iona Preparatory School.

Brother Thomas R. Sanger, CFC, has been appointed superior of the brothers' community at Rice High School in New York. After finishing studies at Iona College, Brother Sanger taught at St. Cecilia's School in New York City. In 1974, he was assigned to Colegio Nuestra Senora del Pilar in Arequipa, Peru. He taught there and in other Peruvian schools for the next 11 years. In 1985, he was reassigned to the United States at Bishop Kearney, where he is involved with recruiting and the ministry program. He will assume duties at Rice High School in September.

Kristen Wylie, a third-year art student at Cardinal Mooney High School, has been selected to study in the New York State of Visual Arts summer program. Wylie was one of only 150 students from across the state accepted to participate in the program, which runs from July 10 to August 6 at Fredonia State College.

Wylie was chosen for the program as a result of her artistic abilities, her teacher's nomination and the reputation of Cardinal Mooney's art program.

Composer Bart Dentino made a musical visit to St. Charles Borromeo School Tuesday, March 1. Students in pre-school through grade three joined Dentino in a sing-along. He presented a history of pop music from the 1950s through the 1980s for fourth-through eighth-graders. He also conducted two workshops about songwriting and music awareness for seventh- and eighth-graders.
