Bishop appoints Elmira pastor to appeal post

Bishop Matthew H. Clark recently announced the appointment of Father Daniel F. Holland, pastor of St. Patrick's Church in Elmira, as the 1988/89 Annual Thanks Giving Appeal assistant coordinator.

Father Holland will work in conjunction with Father James M. Moynihan, diocesan TGA coordinator, and the appeal director, and with them will also be responsible for the overall management of the campaign.

Father Holland will also work with members of the TGA's Priests' Advisory and Communications committees to develop marketing aspects of the appeal. He will become diocesan appeal coordinator in 1989.

Father Holland was ordained to the priesthood on June 5, 1965, and has served as pastor of St. Patrick's in Elmira, since September, 1979.
