Stage, screen actor Anthony Zerbe schedules third benefit for Rochester's St. Martin's Place

For the third consecutive year, actor Anthony Zerbe will give a benefit performance for St. Martin's Kitchen, the Sisters' of St. Joseph neighborhood meal program in Rochester's northeast region. The performance is scheduled for 1 p.m. on Saturday, June 25, at GeVa Theatre, 75 Woodbury Blvd., Rochester.

Zerbe, who is perhaps most popularly known for his portrayal of Lt. Trench in television's "Harry O," began the series of benefits in 1986, after learning about St. Martin's from Sister Ann Patrice Carrigan, SSJ, GeVa's literary director. The meal program is administered by Sisters Margaret Brennan and Marie Brown, and operates solely through donations.

While he starred in GeVa Theatre's world premiere production of *Diminished Capacity*, Zerbe presented a one-man dramatic rendering of the poetry of e.e. cummings. Last year, during GeVa's *The Misanthrope*, Zerbe teamed with Roscoe Lee Brown for a performance of modern American poetry.

This year, he will be joined by MCA recording artist John Jarvis for the special performance piece *Prelude to Lime Creek*. The performance will consist of Zerbe reading from Joe Henry's new novel *Lime Creek*, which re-

counts a young man's journey into the wilderness of self. Jarvis will weave into the program a selection of songs, which he wrote with Henry from their upcoming album.

Henry's lyrics have been sung and recorded by such artists as Frank Sinatra, Roberta Flack, John Denver, Bobby Darrin, Peter Paul and Mary, and Mickey Newbury. Jarvis is one of the world's top session musicians, a leading Nashville songwriter and a winner of numerous awards.
