Sister Mary Frederica Konz, RSM, native of Naples, at 86

Sister Mary Frederica Konz, a Sister of Mercy for 69 years, died Thursday, June 6, at the Mercy congregation's motherhouse in Brighton after a long illness. She was 86.

Mary Antonia Konz was born in Naples, N.Y., where she entered the Sisters of Mercy from St. Januarius Parish at age 16. Taking as her religious name Sister Mary Frederica, she professed her perpetual vows in 1924.

Sister Konz taught in diocesan schools for 30 years. Her first teaching assignment came at St. Ann's School in Hornell, where she

stayed for 23 years (1919-1940, 1959-1960, 1966-1967). She also served as principal at the elementary school from 1937 to 1940.

From 1937 to 1939 she traveled by train on weekends from Hornell to St. Bonaventure College, where she earned her teaching certificate.

She served as the congregation's bursar from 1940 to 1943. She was director of housekeeping at the motherhouse from 1943 to 1951, and at St. James Mercy Hospital in Hornell from 1951 to 1959.

Sister Konz was the supervisor at St. Joseph's School in Penfield beginning in 1960, and taught there for seven years.

She cared for ill members of her family until 1974, when she became the housekeeper at Omega-Mendon Manor, a former home for retired priests in Mendon.

Sister Konz was admitted to Lourdes Hall in 1987.

She is survived by her brother, Nick Konz, of Naples; two sisters, Elizabeth Vierhile, also of Naples, and Ann Piefer of Canandaigua; and three nephews.

Mass of the Resurrection was celebrated at the motherhouse on Saturday, June 18. Interment was at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery in Rochester.

Conference on AIDS set for St. Mary's Hospital

AIDS will be the topic of discussion at a full-day conference on Saturday, July 16, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., at St. Mary's Hospital in

Rochester. The conference, entitled "Medicine, Law and Morality: Focus on AIDS," will examine the medical, ethical moral and legal challenges AIDS poses for the community.

Open to all health care professionals and the general public, the conference is designed to increase understanding of AIDS patients' needs, the care they require and how to cope with the course of the disease.

Topics will include the facts and fallacies of AIDS, the role of the health care professional, psychosocial aspects of AIDS and living with AIDS.

The conference will be co-sponsored by St. Mary's Hospital; St. Bernard's Institute, and the Catholic Physicians' Guild. Dr. Fernando Ona of St. Mary's Hospital and Dr. William Valenti of the University of Rochester are co-directors of the conference.
