to cope with the after-effects of their terrible loss. But at times, those resources seem inadequate. "Maybe that's what we had to go through to get a better place," Rickey Holloway said. "But sometimes I ask the Lord, 'Why

Even in cases where the lack of affordable rental housing isn't life-threatening, it can have a killing effect on families less resilient than the Holloways.

Unable to locate an affordable apartment, Bridget Hilsinger — a co-worker of Rickey Holloway's — and Otis Rosser have been living separately for months. Hilsinger and the couple's three-year-old son are staying with her mother, while Rosser and their other son, age 6, live with his parents.

Last summer, the family moved into a sixroom house on Buerman Road in Sodus. In lieu of rent, the landlord agreed to allow them to insulate the house over the course of a year. "It wasn't much more than a frame," Hilsinger recalled

Several months later, although Hilsinger said she and Rosser had insulated all but the bathroom, the agreement fell apart and their landlady demanded \$200 a month in rent.

Hilsinger said she complied for the first month, but when no improvements were made to the house, she subsequently refused to pay. The landlady then not only evicted them, Hilsinger said, but "took us to court, claiming we owed \$1,000 or something."

Such landlord-tenant disputes contribute to the vicious cycle that keeps to a minimum the supply of housing for low-income residents of Wayne County and other rural regions. Because rental housing is scarce to begin with, prices are usually inflated. Once a family has

moved in, they have little incentive to continue paying rent they can ill-afford for housing that may be substandard and — as in the case of the Holloways' wooden-frame trailer — downright dangerous.

"The landlords are part of it too, — they won't fix these places," Holloway said. "They put off fixing things until finally, when they come out, you're floating in water up to your neck, you're about to get electrocuted or you're freezing to death."

Even responsible landlords, in turn, become reluctant to accept tenants for fear that they will refuse to pay rent or will damage the prop-

The Holloways should be spared yet anoth-

er search for an accommodating landlord. By this October, they hope to build a new home on a half-acre of land off of Pound Road with financing from CASH and the Farmer's Home Administration.

Meanwhile, Rickey Holloway is taking part in the search for a broader solution to Wayne
