Donald J. Foley at 70; veterans' Catholic Layman of the Year for 1979

Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated for Donald J. Foley at St. Thomas the Apostle Church on Monday, August 8. Fr. James L. James Callan was the principal celebrant. Concelebrating the Mass were Monsignor Richard K. Burns, Monsignor Richard M. Quinn, Father Thomas F. Corbett, Father Daniel Hogan and Father John Morgan.



Mr. Foley died of cancer on Friday, August 5, 1988, at Rochester General Hospital. He was 70 years of age.

A safety inspector at Eastman Kodak Corporation, Mr. Foley retired from the company in 1981 after 44 years. He served as a medic with the 11th Armored Division during World War II.

Mr. Foley was active in many parish and church organizations, serving as president of St. Thomas' Legion of Mary, and as a member of the Daily Mass League, the pro-life or-

ganization, the parish council, the Building Management Committee, and the St. Thomas Men's Club. He was also a eucharistic minister, an usher and a lector.

In addition, he was a leader in the Nocturnal Adoration Society, a life member of the Notre Dame Retreat League, a member of the Ancient Order of Hibernians, Aquinas Institute booster for the class of 1935, and a member of the Parent's Club of Bishop Kearney High School.

In 1979, Mr. Foley received the Catholic Layman of the Year award from the Monroe County Catholic War Veterans, of which he was a past-commander.

Mr. Foley is survived by his wife, Mary; four daughters and a son-in-law, Kathleen Gahagan of Milford, Conn., Eileen and Douglas Mann of Washington, D.C., Patricia Foley of Savannah, Ga., and Theresa Foley; four sons, Michael of Washington, D.C., Daniel of San Francisco, Thomas and Robert Foley; two grandchildren, Maggie and Jackie Gahagan; a brother and sister-in-law, Harold and Thelma Foley of Buffalo; a brother-in-law and two sisters-in-law, Joseph and Joan Brophy and Dorothy Brophy; and several nieces and nephews.

Mass of Christian burial for Sister St. Teresa Roche of the Sisters of St. Joseph was celebrated in the motherhouse chapel by Monsignor William Shannon on Wednesday, July 27.

Sister Roche died in St. Mary's Hospital on July 22, 1988. She was 83 years of age.

A native of Pittston, Pa., Sister Roche entered the Sisters of St. Joseph from St. John the Evangelist Parish in that city in 1934. She was a graduate of St. Joseph's Commercial High School in Pittston, and attended Nazareth College of Rochester.

During her years of active service, Sister Roche served in many capacities. She was bookkeeper at St. Ann's Home on Lake Avenue, St. Joseph's Villa, and St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira. Sister Roche also taught school at Blessed Sacrament and Holy Apostles, Rochester; St. Mary's, Canandaigua; and St. Michael's, Penn Yan.
