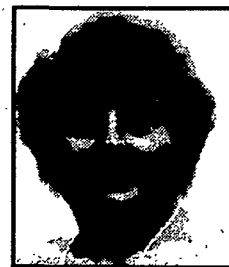
Group plans meeting
