St. Augustine's, Rochester — The parish's neighborhood outreach center, St. Theresa's, at 370 Chili Ave., is sponsoring a series of Thursday-evening sessions concerning theological issues facing those who are ministering, or who are interested in ministering, to the urban poor and to those suffering psychological alienation from the Church and their communities.

Each session runs from 7:30-9 p.m. Topics are as follows: September 29 — "Who is my neighbor?" Father Sebastian Falcone, professor of New Testament studies at St. Bernard's Institute; October 6 — "Life and Faith, a psychological perspective;" Dr. Rosalyn A. Karaban, assistant professor of ministry studies at St. Bernard's Institute; October 13 — "Bridging the alienation syndrome through psychosocial clubs;" Paula Dumont, St. Theresa's director, and Joan Nobling, director of Operation Friendship; October 20 — "When I don't agree with the Church's teaching;" Dr. Marvin L. Krier Mich, associate professor of moral theology at St. Bernard's, and a member of the Diocesan Theological Commission;

October 27 — "Soul friends: A model for growth and affirmation;" Sister Margaret Mattle, from Mercy Prayer Center and Bob Annechino, from St. Theresa's; November 3 — "Approaches to psycho-social growth and development;" a panel of mental-health-care professionals from the DePaul Clinic will discuss the topic and practical guidelines for urban ministry; November 10 — "In celebration of service;" presentation of resources available to urban ministers. An interdenominational liturgy will conclude each evening.

**Parish celebrating anniversary**

St. Januarius, Naples — The parish will celebrate Widmer Wine Company's 100th anniversary at 10 a.m. Mass, Sunday, Sept. 25. The theme of the Mass is "Fruit of the vine and work of human hands." Widmer employees will serve as lectors and Eucharistic ministers at the Mass, which will commemorate living and deceased employees of the company and their families. A coffee hour featuring grape specialties will follow Mass.

**St. Patrick's launches RCIA**

St. Patrick's, Victor — The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults will start with an informational meeting on Monday, Sept. 26, at 7:30 p.m. in the School of Religion on High Street. Parishioners interested in working for RCIA, or people interested in joining the Catholic Church are welcome.

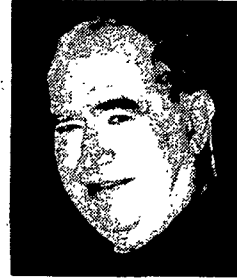
A sponsor and a spiritual director will be needed for each person interested in becoming a Catholic, though both roles can be filled by one person. Catechists, teachers and hospitality ministers are also needed. Each role will be explained at the meeting.

St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, has reached an agreement with Corning Community College to allow the college to use three floors of the Dunn Memorial Building as dorm space for students. The building, which formerly housed the St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing, currently accommodates a day care center for hospital employees and lodging for families and visitors of hospital patients.

Father Julian Phelan, OFM Cap., celebrated his 50th anniversary in the order on August 26. On Labor Day, he observed his anniversary at an 11 a.m. Mass at Mary Immaculate Friary in Garrison, N.Y.

Father Phelan is vicar at St. Fidelis Friary in Interlaken, where he has served since 1974. He entered the order in 1938, making his perpetual profession of vows on August 28, 1942. He was ordained a priest June 5, 1946. Following his ordination, he served as associate pastor at St. Francis Parish (1947-48) and St. Benedict the Moor Parish (1949-54), both in Milwaukee, Wis. He also served as administrator of Blessed Martin de Porres Parish in Milwaukee (1950-54), and was assigned to St. Francis Friary in Providence, R.I. (1954-55).

In 1955, the New York City-born Franciscan was appointed guardian and pastor of Our Lady Queen of Angels Friary and Parish in East Harlem, N.Y., where he served until 1958. From 1958 to 1974, he was active in retreat ministry, and was based at the former St. Joseph Friary in Fultonville, N.Y.

**Parish Notes****Corning parish marks 75th**

St. Vincent de Paul, Corning — The parish celebrates its 75th anniversary this month with a Solemn Mass of Thanksgiving, Sunday, Sept. 25, at 12:15 p.m. Founded in 1913, it was the only parish outside the Rochester metropolitan area established by Bishop Thomas F. Hickey during his administration of the diocese from 1910-1929.

St. Vincent's was established as a combination church/school at the corner of Dodge Ave. and Ellicot St. to alleviate the overcrowdedness at St. Mary's on State Street. The building was completed by March, 1914, and the Sisters of Mercy subsequently staffed the school. Bishop Hickey named Father John A. Conway as the parish's first pastor.

Father Joseph Vincent Guilfoil, pastor from 1940-1964, directed the building of the present church and rectory in 1955.

The current pastor, Father Robert C. MacNamara, appointed in 1983, recently remarked: "The story of St. Vincent's in Corning might well be divided into the time before and after Vatican II. The current new look in the church is oriented to shared responsibility of the bishop, priests and people... (This) was not the case in the old days when the pastor exercised a concentrated authority. We have a distance to go, but we are gaining on the new sharing idea."

**Scripture classes planned**

St. Rita's, Webster — The Adult Religious Education Department will present a scripture series on consecutive Wednesdays, from September 28 to October 26 from 7:30-9:00 p.m. in the school's audio-visual room.

Father Bill Graf, pastor of the Most Precious Blood Church and an adjunct associate professor at St. John Fisher College, will open the series with the topic: "Elusive Presence — How God reveals Himself in sign and word in the Old Testament." Deni Mack, a member of the pastoral team at Corpus Christi, will speak on "Prayer and the Holy Spirit in the Gospel of Luke and Acts" on October 5, and "Christ according to Paul and John" on October 12. Sister Karlien Back will discuss "A basic introduction to parables" on October 19, and she will conclude the series with a look at "Revelation" on October 26.

At St. John Fisher College's Founders' Dinner, to be held Saturday, Oct. 1, Gaynelle Wethers, principal of St. Monica's School, will receive the Rev. John F. Murphy President's Award for outstanding service to education in the greater Rochester community. Daniel Meyers, executive director of the Al Sigi Center and a 1971 graduate of the college, will receive the Most Rev. James E. Kearney Award for demonstrating career achievement, significant humanitarian effort, and outstanding direct contribution to the Fisher community. Father Joseph Trovato, CSB, eastern U.S. regional representative of the Basilian Fathers and a Fisher trustee, will be given the Rev. Hugh J. Haffney Award for going beyond normal professional requirements in service to Fisher.

St. John Fisher College has announced that Charles M. Natoli, associate professor of philosophy, was awarded the college's Distinguished Scholarly Achievement Award for his dedication to the pursuit of education. During his 12 years at the college, Natoli has received numerous awards, grants and fellowships in recognition of his work, which includes articles, reviews and a book on the works of different philosophers.

The college has also announced that Leslie J. Schwartz, assistant professor of chemistry, has been named the winner of the 1988 Award for Teaching Excellence. She was nominated for the award by students who cited her dedication and skill in teaching.
