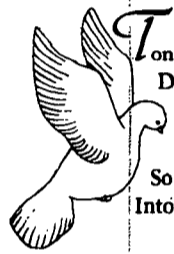

The trip "is part of the parish's continued commitment to our sisters and brothers in Central America," the spokeswoman said.
