The Supreme Court legalized unrestricted abortion in 1973 by a 7-2 decision. Today the Court is almost evenly divided on abortion and could end abortion-on-demand depending on new appointments.

THE NEXT PRESIDENT will appoint up to four new Supreme Court Justices. (Three will be over 80 on inauguration day.)

THE NEXT PRESIDENT will decide whether millions of lives are saved or the killing continues for the next generation.

- More than one out of every four unborn children is killed by abortion.
- Before the Reagan-Bush Administration over \$250 million of your tax dollars were used to pay for abortions.
- Over 1.5 million abortions are now performed annually. Over 20 million children have died from abortion since 1973.
- Abortion is legal for the *entire* nine months of pregnancy.
- Most abortions done on teenagers are done *without* parental knowledge or consent.

Do You Know Where The Candidates Stand?

George Bush

- ★ George Bush has stated, "I believe that abortion is wrong... federal funds should not be used for abortion."
- ★ George Bush has called abortion "a tragedy of shattering proportions," and says "states should have the right to prohibit abortion... Our Constitution is and should be designed to protect human life." George Bush supports a constitutional amendment to reverse the Supreme Court abortion-on-demand decision, and supports the Republican Party Platform, which calls for the appointment of U.S. Supreme Court Justices who "respect traditional family values and the sanctity of innocent human life."
- ★ Dan Quayle opposes the Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion. In 1983 he voted for an amendment to reverse that decision. Senator Quayle has voted consistently against abortion funding.
- ★ George Bush and Dan Quayle have been endorsed by the National Right to Life Committee.

Michael Dukakis

- As Governor, Michael Dukakis twice vetoed Massachusetts budget bills because they did not contain tax funding of abortion. Dukakis supports federal funding of abortion on demand.
- As a Massachusetts state legislator in 1970, Dukakis filed a bill to legalize abortion throughout pregnancy. He has stated that he supports the Supreme Court decision which legalized unrestricted abortion. He opposes measures to restrict abortion, and can be counted on to appoint Supreme Court Justices who will continue unrestricted abortion.
- Lloyd Bentsen supports the Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion. In 1983 he voted against an amendment to reverse that decision. Since 1977 he has voted in the U.S. Senate 40 times for abortion funding, and only once against it.
- Michael Dukakis and Lloyd Bentsen have been endorsed by the pro-abortion National Abortion Rights Action League.
