sight, Sister Agnes Donovan can attest to the impact her teaching and counseling has made on hundreds of young Guatemalan women who have studied at Colegio Monte Maria, a Maryknoll-run college and secondary school in Guatemala City. "Seeing the response to our efforts in many of our graduates who try, whatever their careers, to defend human rights and dignity, and to be of service to their country, is bringing about change for a more humane world," Sister Donovan said during a recent visit to the United States. "Sharing mission with a dedicated group of local teachers who are committed to the challenge of forming Christian leaders among the youth of Guatemala has been a major source of satisfaction for me."

While the distance Rochester's missioners have traveled must be counted by some measure beyond miles, they nevertheless continue to affect those who know and support them, those who hear their stories, and those who will someday welcome them back home.

"I don't know what (Mark's) profession will be when he leaves this, but it will be peopleoriented, serving people, because that's the way he is," said Elizabeth VanDerwater, Mark's mother. "He often said he felt he was going to get out of this a lot more than he would give.'

Yet in contrast to the challenge and reward implicit in a mission vocation are struggles nearly all missioners face in some degree -- disillusionment, frustration, disorientation.
