Deacons seek school supplies

ROCHESTER — Deacons at Our Lady of Perpetual Help and Holy Name of Jesus parishes are seeking donated school furniture and supplies to ease a desperate shortage in Jamaica.

Deacons Klaus Schulz of Our Lady of Perpetual Help and Richard Lombard at Holy Name of Jesus have already shipped 300 school desks and chairs—collected from Our Lady of Perpetual Help, St. Margaret Mary, St. Lawrence, and St. Charles Borromeo—to the Allegheny Franciscan Sisters, who operate several schools on the island.

Both deacons and their wives are seeking donations of still more school furniture and supplies for a second shipment later this month.

During several visits to Jamaica, Deacon Schulz has personally observed the impact of shortages of such supplies, including a 40-percent illiteracy rate and rampant unemployment. "We have a 60 percent shortage of school furniture in Jamaica," reported Hugh Dawes, Jamaican minister of education.
