Mass to be sung in Latin

WATERLOO — St. Mary's Church will mark Holy Week with various services and devotions, including the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday sung in Latin.

On Palm Sunday, the noon Mass will be followed by exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Benediction will take place at 3 p.m. Penitential services will take place Tuesday and Wednesday evening at 7:15 p.m.

Mass on Holy Thursday will begin at 7:15 p.m. The Latin portions of the Mass will be in accord with current church guidelines, and will include Gregorian chants. Scripture readings and prayers will be in English. The traditional procession to the repository will conclude the liturgy, followed by several hours of solemn adoration.

Good Friday's commemoration of Christ's passion will begin at 2 p.m. At 7:15 p.m., the weekly Stations of the Cross will be said. On Saturday, at 11:30 a.m., a service for blessing of Easter foods will take place. The Easter vigil will be celebrated at 7:15 p.m., beginning with the blessing of new fire outside the church.

Parish seeking receipts to assist area food bank

ITHACA — St. Catherine of Siena parishioners who shop at Tops grocery stores are asked to save their receipts and drop them into the box at the main church entrance. For every \$300 worth of tapes collected, the parish will receive \$1 in cash.

The Teacher Resource Center in Stanley has awarded Kathleen Scaglione-Theimer, Spanish teacher at Geneva's DeSales High School a \$500 grant to support her project, "Role Playing: Enrich Conversation in the Target Language." The project is designed to analyze and interpret students' values, attitudes and social behaviors. The resulting model can be used in any modern foreign language class. Scaglione-Theimer, a graduate student at State University College at Geneseo, has also received the Empire State Challenger Fellowship for Teachers.

Karen Webb, a parishioner at St. Theodore's Church in Rochester, was named "Pro-lifer of the Year" by Project Life of Rochester at the group's third annual banquet on Friday, Feb. 24. The banquet, which featured Operation Rescue leader Randall Terry, was held at the Mapledale Party House in Rochester.

Webb, who is the second recipient of the award, was cited for "serving super sacrificially, but in obscurity" according to Project Life Executive Director David E. Long.

According to Long, Webb is the only person in Monroe County who has participated in all three "rescue missions" the group has conducted.

Long also called Webb "the most consistent and dedicated sidewalk counselor" over the last two-and-a-half years.

Bill Zabelny, a senior at Bishop Kearney High School, was featured in the "Faces in the Crowd" column of the Feb. 20 issue of Sports Illustrated. Zabelny, who lost the lower half of his right leg four years ago, recently scored his first varsity hockey goal as the Kings downed Brighton High School, 10-6.
