School association offering Caribbean cruise vacation

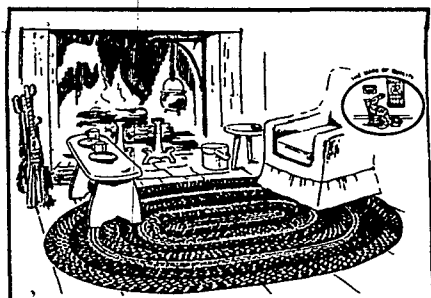

At a March 4 convention and banquet at the Maplewood Inn, John Sdoia was reelected county commander of the Catholic War Veterans. At the same banquet, Ralph Bleier, a member of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Post, received a plaque recognizing his selection as "Catholic War Veteran of the Year." In addition, Dennis "Andy" Merritt, was announced as the winner of "The Catholic Layman of the Year" award. He will be honored at the War Veterans' Communion breakfast to be held April 23 at the Diplomat Party House.

The award was presented at the exhibition's opening March 4. Nichols is a live-in staff member at the Cephas-Attica residence for recent parolees.
