PARISH NOTES

Parish to conduct census

MACEDON — St. Patrick's Parish will conduct a census Sunday, April 23, from 1 to 5 p.m. to identify all baptized Catholics living within the parish boundaries.

With a theme of "Reaching All in Friendship," the census will involve 150 home visitors calling on the estimated 4,000 residences in the parish. Each Catholic family will be asked to fill out a census card. This information will be used to identify the needs of parishioners to guide the formation of new programs.

A sign-up will be held in the church on Sunday, April 30, after all the Masses for those who were missed or do not live within the parish boundaries.
