Give your window coverings a summer replacement. Think of fabric or pleated shades or curtains made of sheets. or swathe the windows in lace.


Roll up the rugs on hardwood or tile floors for a cooling effect. Or

Clutter is in again on the old coffee table, but it's studied clutter. Fresh ideas are seashells, hunks of coral, rocks and minerals, sculptures and flower arrangements.

Change your centerpiece. Fresh flowers in non-vases (bowls, cups, mugs) are cheery, and so are candles floating in a bowl of water. If you like the Southwestern look, use pots of flowering cactus — real or silk.

Break your dining habits. Make your dining table festive with frilly new place mats and coordinating napkins. Mix and match plates, an ideal way to extend the life of incomplete patterns.
