**Ukrainian church head to visit Elmira Heights**

ELMIRA HEIGHTS — Josyp Terelya, international lay leader of the underground Ukrainian Catholic Church, will be the guest speaker at two events scheduled from April 28-30 at St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Church, 410 E. McCann's Boulevard.



Terelya, who is recognized as an authority on the Soviet Union, will present a free lecture at 7 p.m. Friday, April 28, in the church hall. The lecture will focus on recent events in the Soviet Union in light of glasnost and perestroika.

Terelya will also be the guest of honor at the dedication of the first shrine in honor of the Mother of God of Hrushiv. Terelya claims that in April, 1987, he and thousands of other witnesses saw an apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary in that Ukrainian village. He joined a pilgrimage to Hrushiv in May of that year, claiming that he saw the Virgin Mary six times.

The dedication will be followed by a traditional Ukrainian Easter dinner at 6 p.m. All of the events are open to the public. Call 607/734-7666 for information.
