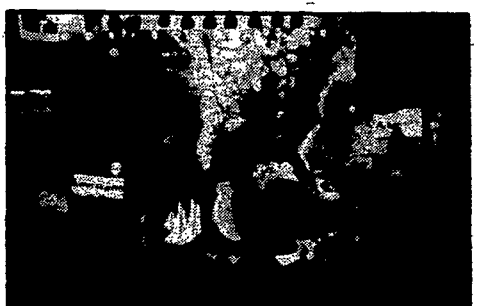
**NEIGHBORS**

The St. John Fisher College Board of Trustees voted March 14 to name the Rochester House dormitory **Joseph B. Dorsey Hall**, in honor of the former dean and interim president, who died Dec. 28, 1988.

Father Dorsey served at the Pittsford college in various capacities from 1961 until his death. From 1961-70, he was an associate professor of English, dean and vice president of the college. From 1970-72, he was executive vice president of the college, and from 1973-76, acting dean of student life. In 1978, he was elected to the school's board of trustees. He served as interim president of the college in 1981 following the retirement of Father Charles Lavery. In 1985, he became an honorary trustee of the college.

Rochester House, built in 1986, is a two-story, two-wing building that has 80 rooms.

Eileen Krasavage Hopkins, a graduate of Our Mother of Sorrows School, Greece, and Cardinal Mooney High School, received a doctorate in psychology during commencement exercises at Vanderbilt University.
