chester and St. Francis of Assisi Parish, where he is currently pastor.

Father Albert L. Delmonte, pastor of St. Salome's Parish, Rochester, was ordained June 6, 1964. As an assistant pastor, the Auburn native served at Corpus Christi Rochester, 1964-67; St. Ann's, Hornell, 1969-72; and Christ the King, Rochester, 1972-75. From 1967 to 1969, Father Delmonte was coordinator of religious education at King's Prep High School in Rochester.



Assigned to Guardian Angels Parish in Henrietta in 1975, he served for two years as associate pastor before becoming pastor at St. Anthony's in Elmira. In 1982, Father Delmonte received his current assignment to St. Salome's.

Father William Donnelly, parochial vicar at Our Lady of Mercy Church in Hicksville, N.Y., was ordained June 6, 1964, and assigned as assistant pastor to St. John the Evangelist Church, Humboldt St., Rochester.

In 1969, Father Donnelly moved to Monroe Community College, where he served as chaplain for seven years. A native of Auburn, he undertook his present assignment in 1986.

Father Joseph M. Jankowiak, ordained June 6, 1964, is pastor of St. Mary's Mother, Horseheads.



After ordination, he served as assistant at St. Thomas the Apostle, 1964-67. Following a brief stint in his home neighborhood as assistant at St. Stanislaus, Rochester, Father Jankowiak in 1968 left to pursue graduate studies at the University of Munster in Westfalen, Germany, and later in Rome. After earning a license in theology from the University of St. Thomas and a doctorate in moral theology from the Gregorian University, both in Rome, he returned to Rochester, serving as professor of moral theology at St. Bernard's Seminary until 1978.

Father Jankowiak then returned to St. Stanislaus as pastor, remaining until 1984, when he became pastor in Horseheads.

Father Roy J. Kiggins, is pastor of the Church of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Brockport.



The Rochester native, ordained June 6, 1964, went first to St. John of Rochester, Perinton, as assistant pastor. He also served as assistant at Our Lady of Lourdes, Elmira, 1964-71; the Church of the Good Shepherd, Henrietta,

ta, 1971-72; and St. Mary's, Canandaigua, 1972-73.

In 1973, he became co-pastor of Good Shepherd Parish — an assignment in which he remained until 1987, when he accepted the pastorate in Brockport.

Father John M. Mulligan, vicar general and moderator of the pastoral office, was ordained June 6, 1964.



His appointments as assistant pastor were to: Immaculate Conception, Ithaca, 1964-66; St. Patrick's, Corning, 1966-71; and St. Mary's, Au-

burn, 1971-73.

The Rochester native then moved to St. John the Evangelist Parish on Humboldt St., where he was co-pastor for eight years. Beginning in 1981, he served for two years as pastor of St. Stephen's, Geneva, before being named director of the newly created diocesan Division of Urban Ministry in 1983. In addition to his diocesan responsibilities, Father Mulligan was named pastor of St. Anthony of Padua Church, Rochester.

In 1988, Bishop Matthew H. Clark appointed Father Mulligan vicar general and to the new post of moderator of the pastoral office.

His passion sparked a certain sarcasm in His chiding of the denying Peter, and a deep sorrow in the bold betrayal of Judas. At Gethsemane, a suffering passion of human fear rang in His cry, "Father, let this ... pass from me!" No. No stoic was Christ, despite His celebrated tranquility. A very real zeal — passion — is between the lines all through the Gospels. It dominates!

So, when Father Haring insists that humans, as mature "people of God," must be passionate, he is a long way from heretical turf. He is true to the Christ message and to Christ.

And when "Joshua," in very earthy words and with no little animation, scores the narrow-minded biases of the hierarchy,

we must allow a little hyperbole.

Today, no less than in Christ's time, sacred essentials need earnest exploring and discourse — but not at the expense of goodwill, joy and well-intentioned dialogue among those of differing views. Only when informed by a genuine, selfless Christ-love among adversaries will the struggle yield sustaining fruit.

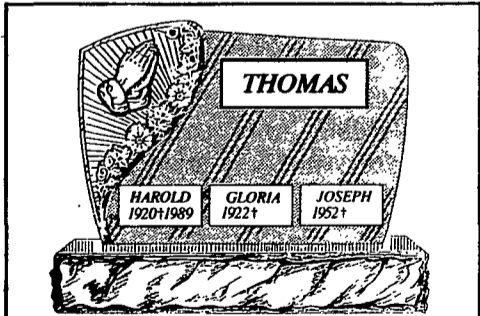
