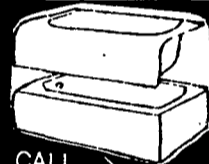

PARISH NOTES

Elmira parish adds new church window

ELMIRA — Parishioners at St. Anthony's in Elmira are celebrating a new addition to their church: a 16-foot-high stained-glass window.

The installation of the window in the church, 204 W. Washington Ave., was completed Thursday, May 3 — the Feast of the Ascension.

According to Father James P. Collins, pastor of St. Anthony's since 1982, the project is the second major change to the church in recent months. Late last year, a local architect added a peak structure and a seven-foot fiberglass cross to the edifice's horizontal roof line.

With the installation of the new stained-glass window, which depicts St. Anthony holding the Christ Child, the pastor and parish realized a longtime dream, Father Collins said. "We have a building that looks like a church," the pastor remarked. "We have wanted to convert the facade of the building for a long time."

The former St. Anthony's Church was

completely ravaged by a fire in 1947. The new church building's upper level of the church contains school classrooms, and the chapel is located in the basement.

Father Collins said parishioners initially discussed the idea for a new stained glass window in the church two years ago. They contacted Patrick Saxe, a local artist and high school art teacher who designs stained glass windows. Saxe made the window in his own studio, the priest said.

The window measures 16 feet by 6-and-a-half feet, and consists of 18 frames — six down and three across. It replaces a 35-panel plain glass window.

Michael Kenna, who is in charge of lighting at the Clemens Center, will design the back lighting for the window.

"It looks gorgeous," said Father Collins, who would not divulge the cost of the window. The priest said that \$5,000 for the project came from church coffers, and individual donations paid the balance. Father Collins and Father William A. Burns, who was pastor of St. Anthony's from 1953 to 1977, each contributed \$1,000 toward the cost of the window.

Father Burns will bless the facade and the new window at a 5 p.m. ceremony at June 14. The parish has planned a dinner dance at Elmira College afterward.
