Priest to celebrate 40th

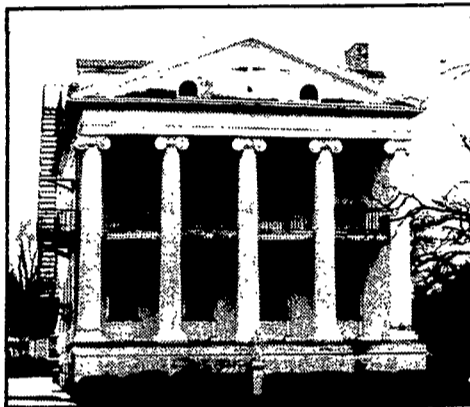

St. Mary's accepts offer; will sell historic convent

CANANDAIGUA — Citing rising operating costs and declining numbers of sisters, St. Mary's Parish has accepted a purchase offer for its historic convent.

A still unnamed developer has made what parish business manager Stephen Tempest called an "acceptable offer" for the Greek Revival-style building, located on North Main and Gibson streets. On April 17, the parish council accepted the offer, and on May 10, Bishop Matthew H. Clark approved the sale.

According to Tempest, final details of the sale have yet to be worked out. The property must be surveyed, and the local planning board has to approve subdividing the parish's property. The business manager predicted that, if everything proceeds

as planned, the sale will become final in mid to late August.

Father James Burke, St. Mary's pastor, said the parish has been discussing options for the convent for the last five years. The building, he said, was too large for the four Sisters of St. Joseph still living there. Last October, the SSJ congregation encouraged the parish to look for alternative housing for the sisters. Money from the convent sale would be used to purchase suitable housing for the sisters, Tempest said.

In recent years, the building has fallen into disrepair, requiring expensive maintenance, Tempest said. Three years ago, for example, several of the pillars gracing the front of the building collapsed. "It's just slowly and surely nickel-and-diming us," he said.

The building, which is registered in the National Register of Historic Places and the New York State Register of Historic Places, was originally purchased by the parish in 1873 for \$20,000. During the 1960s, as many as 14 sisters lived in the convent.

Parish schedules census
