### College professor to lead two seminars in Wayland

WAYLAND — Dr. Joseph Lafaro of Gannon College in Erie, Pa., will visit St. Joseph's Parish July 17-21 to conduct five-day seminars geared for both adults and high school students.

## NEIGHBORS

Gina M. Giancursio, a senior at Cardinal Mooney High School, is one of four recipients of the 1989 Keuka College Leaders Scholarship. To earn the scholarship, she took part in a day-long competition that measures and recognizes leadership and significant accomplishments in community service.



In addition to receiving a financial award, Giancursio will become a member of the Keuka Project Action Committee, a group of student leaders who undertake a meaningful community service project each year. She plans to major in special and elementary education.

On June 3, Father Bertrand Hodes celebrated 50 years as a Franciscan priest. He graduated from Our Lady of Perpetual Help School, Rochester, in 1926 and spent six years at St. Andrew's Seminary. In 1933, he entered the novitiate of the Franciscan Conventual Order at Syracuse and was professed in 1934. After studies at St. Anthony-on-the-Hudson in Rensselaer and at Catholic University, he was ordained in Albany in 1939 and celebrated his first Mass at Our Lady of Perpetual Help on June 4, 1939.

Father Hodes taught at Trenton High School in New Jersey for six years. In

1946, he volunteered to serve in the missions in Costa Rica, where he served at various times as pastor, superior, novice master and commissary provincial. He now resides at St. Francis College.

Eight students at Holy Cross School, Rochester, have successfully completed the Great Books Program, which introduces them to classics of world literature. The eighth-graders are: Nicole Fink, Jaime Tackett, Matt DiPaola and Christian DiPaola. Seventh-grade students finishing the program are: Dan Bachman, Carrie Jones, Heather Fahey and Tricia Delibert.

Brother Michael Patella, OSB, will make his solemn monastic profession at St. John's Abbey, Collegeville Minn., July 11. He graduated from St. Ambrose School in 1969 and from Bishop Kearney High School in 1973. With the Congregation of Christian Brothers for nine years, he taught at Catholic Memorial High School in Boston and Power Memorial Academy in New York.



Brother Patella earned a bachelor's degree in English from Iona College and a master's degree in American Studies from Boston College. Currently, he is finishing his master's of divinity degree at St. John's University in Collegeville and is preparing for doctoral work in the classics.
