**Parish selling tickets to Bobby Vinton concert**

ROCHESTER — St. Stanislaus Parish will begin celebrating its 100th anniversary by presenting the Sept. 16 Bobby Vinton concert, which is scheduled for 8 p.m. at the Eastman Theater.
