#### Fatima statue to pay visit

ROCHESTER — St. Anne's Church, 1640 Mount Hope Ave., will host the National Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Our Lady of Fatima on Wednesday, Aug. 16. The touring statue is a replica of one standing at Fatima and was blessed by Pope Paul VI.

The service will begin at 7 p.m. with an entrance procession and placement of the statue which will then be crowned. Participants will then recite the rosary, after which Guido Del Rose, the statue's escort, will give a talk. Benediction and a ceremony will conclude the service, which is scheduled to end by 9 p.m. For information, call Lee Beaudraut at 716/442-4231.

#### Mass schedules modified in light of staffing change

INTERLAKEN/OVID — With the appointment of Father Nelson Rupert, OFM, pastor of St. Francis Solanus Parish, Interlaken, as administrator of Holy Cross Church, Ovid, the parish councils of the two churches met in joint session to develop new Mass schedules.

After considering the sizes of the churches and the fact that one priest would be serving both parishes, the councils decided to continue the Saturday vigil Masses at 5 p.m. in Ovid and 7:30 p.m. in Interlaken. Sunday schedules will change from 8 and 10 a.m. Masses in both churches to 8:30 a.m. in Interlaken and 10:30 a.m. in Ovid.

The new schedule went into effect the weekend of August 5-6, and will remain in effect until December. The parishes will evaluate the schedules in late November.

Daily Masses will be celebrated on alter-

nate days: Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays in Ovid, and Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays at the Capuchin Friary in Interlaken.

According to Father Rupert, parishioners will be free to participate at Masses in either church, and if they are using envelopes, their financial contributions will be credited toward the parish in which they are registered, regardless of where the envelopes are collected.
