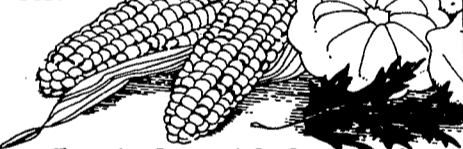

### PARISH NOTES

#### Rosary nights scheduled

SHORTSVILLE — St. Dominic's Parish is offering opportunities to pray the rosary every Monday and Thursday evening.

On Mondays at 7 p.m., the rosary will be said in the church in conjunction with a novena in honor of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal and Benediction to the Blessed Sacrament.

The Queen of Peace Prayer Group meets in the church every Thursday at 7:30 p.m. for the rosary, Scripture readings, litanies of the Sacred Heart, the Blessed Virgin and St. Joseph, and prayers for special intentions.

#### Bishop blesses church at 120th anniversary Mass

AVON — St. Agnes Church marked its 120th anniversary on Sunday, Aug. 13, with Bishop Matthew H. Clark celebrating 11 a.m. Mass. A lawn reception followed.

St. Agnes was founded in 1869 in a former Baptist meeting house in the center of the village. Bishop Bernard McQuaid blessed the cornerstone of the current church in August of that year, but the building's interior was not actually completed until the 1920s.

In the summer of 1988, the parish began renovating and repairing the church's ex-

terior. Interior work began after Mass on Jan. 2 of this year. The Buildings and Properties Committee, directed by Father Charles Bennett, pastor, wanted to coordinate and enhance the interior design to conform to the church's neo-gothic structure. Parishioners' ideas and suggestions were incorporated into the plan.

At last Sunday's Mass, Bishop Clark rededicated the church and the sanctuary.

#### Charismatic Mass slated

## NEIGHBORS

David Yehl, a 1989 graduate of Aquinas Institute, has won a Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship. He is one of only 340 students state-wide to win the scholarship. Scheduled to attend Cornell University in the fall, he was also a National Merit Scholarship finalist.

Amy Attridge of Nazareth Academy has been named winner of the school's Bausch & Lomb Science Award. The science award is presented each year to winners at approximately 5,500 participating schools throughout the United States and Canada. It is given to the junior at each school who attained the highest scholastic standing in science subjects.

Attridge is now eligible for one of several four-year Bausch & Lomb scholarships at the University of Rochester. Scholarship winners are selected on merit, with stipends based on financial needs.

The Colgate Rochester Divinity School/Bexley Hall/Crozer Theological Seminary has named Carl E. Johnson, director of field education and continuing education, as the dean of Crozer, and Andrew C. Davison, director of planned giving, as vice president of development and institutional relations.

Johnson joined the faculty of the divinity school in August, 1988, and holds the academic appointment of assistant professor of American church history. In his new position, he will participate in the planning and implementation of educational programs within the school, and have special concern for those parts of the program related to Baptist traditions and churches.

A member of the school's administration since 1981, Davison served first as director of church relations before becoming director of planned giving. He will now supervise a staff that has responsibility for annual capital and planned giving, communications, leadership enlistment, placement, and alumni and church relations.
