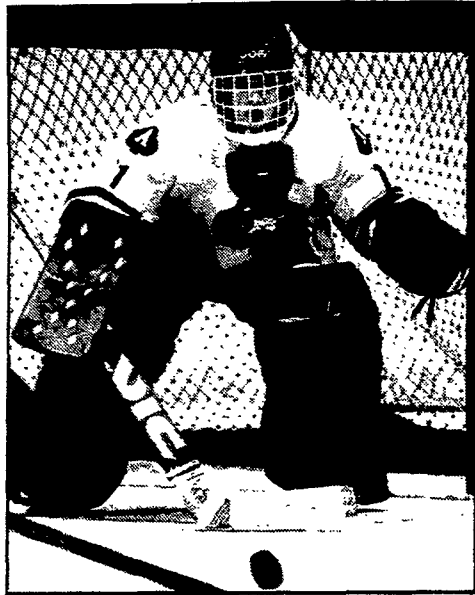


Aquinas names Montgomery hockey coach



David Montgomery will be without Bob Carello this season.

David Montgomery, who played hockey for Geneseo State and the Rochester Monarchs in the early 1980s, has been named the new hockey coach at Aquinas Institute.

School officials announced the appointment of Montgomery, who replaces Rich Gamble, last week.

The new coach of the Little Irish has a tough act to follow in trying to pick up where Gamble — now an assistant for the Niagara Scenic, a Junior A team out of Buffalo — left off. Gamble was 38-4-1 in two seasons at the Dewey Avenue high school, guiding AQ to a Section 5 championship in 1988.

The Little Irish were everyone's favorite to take the title again last year, but they were upset by the Lightening of Greece in the sectional title game.

Montgomery, a co-captain his last season at Geneseo State, will be coaching at the high-school level for the first time, although he has coached hockey at other levels. Montgomery guided a team in the Greater Rochester Hockey League two years ago, and he is currently coaching a midget hockey team.

Among Montgomery's first tasks will be to replace two stars from last year's sectional runner-up team. Goalie Bob Carello (1.67 goals-against average) and forward Chris Fess (51 goals, 19 assists) have joined Gamble, whose son, Jon, played for the Scenic last season. Both Carello and Fess will no doubt benefit from the better talent at the junior level.

Aquinas does return several key players from last year's team, including senior forward Jeff Nuccitelli.
