

Charles W. Donnelly of Fairport

Charles W. Donnelly, a member of St. Louis Parish in Pittsford since 1956, died at his Fairport home on Sunday, Sept. 24, 1989, after a brief illness. He was 90 years old.

Born in Buffalo, N.Y., Mr. Donnelly lived in Varysburg, Wyoming County, before moving to Pittsford. He was a licensed civil engineer and veteran of World War I.

Mr. Donnelly served with the 38th Infantry, Third Division regular army, and received the Purple Heart for wounds he sustained in France.

After earning a bachelor of science degree from the State University of New York at Albany in 1926, Mr. Donnelly moved to Rochester where he worked as a junior engineer with the New York State Department of Transportation.

Before retiring in 1967, he held the title of Supervising Engineer of Maintenance in

District 4.

An avid sportsman, Mr. Donnelly played football and baseball in college before moving on to semi-pro baseball. He later took up golf, which he carefully studied and taught to his grandchildren.

A former member of the New York State Society of Professional Engineers (Monroe Chapter), Mr. Donnelly was also active in the Knights of Columbus, American Legion and Oak Hill Country Club.

Prior to attending St. Louis Church, he was a parishioner at St. Monica's in Rochester.

Mr. Donnelly was predeceased by his wife, Mary (Buckley) Donnelly. He is survived by five daughters: Helene McGrady, Mary Ann Daley, Jane Merkle, Karen Hanss and Susan Murphy; three sisters, Annabel Dawson, Genevieve Brady and Elizabeth Stock; and 14 grandchildren.

Fr. Pat Schimizzi, Watkins Glen native, at 71

Father Pat Schimizzi, S.A.C., pastor of St. Leo the Great Church in Baltimore, Md., and a Watkins Glen native, died on Thursday, Sept. 7, 1989, at Mercy Hospital in Baltimore. He was 71.

The son of Francis and Frances (Calbria) Schimizzi, he was born in Watkins Glen on June 11, 1918. After entering the Immaculate Conception Province of the Society of the Catholic Apostolate (Pallottine Fathers and Brothers), Father Schimizzi was professed on Sept. 8, 1941.

From 1939-1943, Father Schimizzi studied philosophy and theology at the Gregorian University in Rome. He returned to the United States in 1944, when he atten-

ded St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore to complete his theological studies.

Father Schimizzi was ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Joseph Kearney, auxiliary bishop of the Diocese of Brooklyn, on June 26, 1945.

He is survived by five sisters: Sisters Rose, Mary and Catherine — all members of the Religious Teachers Filippini; Josephine Schimizzi; and Elizabeth (Schimizzi) Sabatini; as well as several nieces and nephews.

A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated at St. Leo's in Baltimore. Father Schimizzi was buried at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery in Hammonctown, N.J.

Bishop Clark announces grant recipients

Bishop Matthew H. Clark announced October 2 that 14 pro-life organizations in the Rochester diocese will share \$18,000 in grants made through the Respect Life Fund.

Bishop Clark made the announcement as he officially recognized October as Respect Life Month and October 1 as Respect Life Sunday.

The 14 recipients of the grants are: Birthright of Auburn (\$600); Birthright of Canandaigua (\$1,000); Birthright of Ithaca (\$1,625); Birthright of Ontario (\$900); Birthright of Owego (\$1,350); Birthright of Penn Yan (\$600); Birthright of Rochester (\$880); Catholic Family Center (\$800); Chemung County Right to Life (\$225); Faith Haven (\$900); Melita House (\$2,870); Nazareth Academy (\$4,000); Puzzle Project/Project Rachel (\$1,300); and Southern Tier Office of Social Ministry (\$1,350).

The recipients were chosen after applications for funds were reviewed by a diocesan Respect Life Fund allocations committee and approved by the diocesan Office of Social Ministry board of directors.

Groups seeking a grant from the Respect Life Fund must meet three criteria: they must be not-for-profit organizations that do not perform abor-

tions; they must not make referrals or promote abortion in any way; and they must demonstrate that the project for which they are requesting funds does not duplicate existing services.

In addition, the groups seeking funds must: provide services and care to pregnant women; provide pastoral care to persons who have had or have taken part in an abortion; undertake public education efforts to prevent abortion or promote alternatives to abortion.

The Respect Life Fund is supported by the annual Thanks Giving Appeal and by donations to the Foundation of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Rochester, Inc.

October was established as Respect Life Month by the U.S. Catholic bishops in 1972 in order to focus on the issues that endanger or diminish respect for human life in our society.

In an open letter to the people of the Rochester diocese, Bishop Clark calls the Catholic community to renew its focus on the sanctity of human life.

"As communities centered in Jesus, we search for concrete ways to speak up for life ... Moved by God's deep and abiding love and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we can together act to affirm the sacredness of life."
