In the third quarter, Ike scored his second touchdown of the day on another 13-yard run. Grant Garrett's kick gave DeSales a 26-6 advantage.

The lead ballooned to 32-6 in the fourth quarter after Steve Cannuli plunged into the end zone from the one-yard line.

Bath closed out the scoring with a touchdown in the final moments.

DeSales' win was costly, however, because Walters — who handled all of the team's kicking duties — broke his wrist and will be lost for the season.

Aquinas 35, Marshall 8

Another team to discover its offense Saturday, Oct. 21 was Aquinas, which overwhelmed visiting Marshall 35-8.

The Little Irish (3-3-1) wasted little time in jumping out to a lead, scoring on their first possession. Alva Royston's 12-yard run culminated a 70-yard drive.

Alcindor Coleman scored moments later

after returning a fumble 15 yards for a touchdown. And Aquinas scored once more — this time on an 11-yard run by Royston — on its next drive.

Jim Fisher's successful kicks after each score helped Aquinas build a 21-0 lead before the game was even four minutes old.

The onslaught continued in the second quarter, as Adrian Seay snared a 15-yard scoring toss from Heath Rist. Rist, who finished the game a perfect 6-for-6 for 128 yards passing, then connected with Greg Pelletier for a 10-yard score.

Two more extra-point kicks from Fisher gave the Little Irish a 35-0 lead at the half.

AQ Coach Bob D'Ettore played most of his reserves in the second half. Nevertheless, Marshall was held to just 70 yards in total offense for the game.

Aquinas racked up 270 yards. In addition to his two touchdowns, Royston carried the ball 10 times for 69 yards. Pelletier accounted for 83 yards on three receptions.

This Saturday, Oct. 28, the Little Irish travel to McQuaid.
