

Alfred de Buono, Penfield parishioner, businessman

Alfred de Buono, a parishioner at St. Joseph's in Penfield, died Oct. 16, 1989, of a heart attack at his Penfield home. He was 60 years old.

Mr. de Buono, who owned Desks Plus on East Main Street in Rochester, was remembered as a man who dedicated himself to his family and friends and his work.

A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated Oct. 19 at St. Joseph's Church. Interment was in Oakwood Cemetery, Penfield.

"Al was a person who put his heart and

soul into everything he touched," said Father James Moynihan, St. Joseph's pastor. "You always knew where he stood because he told it like it was."

Those sentiments were shared by Mr. de Buono's acquaintances.

"Al was a dynamic person, well-liked, a gentleman in every respect ... and a true friend who went out of his way to help people," one friend said.

Born in Rochester, Mr. de Buono graduated from East High School. He was drafted by the Army, where he served as

an administrative aide. Mr. de Buono was stationed at Army Headquarters in Japan during the Korean War.

Following the war, Mr. de Buono returned to Rochester and married Barbara Goetz, his wife of 36 years.

He opened his office furnishings business in 1964.

Mr. de Buono was a member of the American Legion, the Greater Rochester Metro Chamber of Commerce and the Rochester Trade Exchange.

An avid gardener, Mr. de Buono en-

joyed the outdoors and being around children.

Besides his wife, Mr. de Buono is survived by two sons, Alan de Buono and Robert de Buono, both of Rochester; three daughters, Carolyn Martin of Arizona, and Marianne Amarin and Nancianne Fiorino, both of Rochester; his mother, Frida de Buono of Rochester; two sisters, Ellen de Buono and Beatrice de Buono, both of Rochester; six grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews.

the bow. It was impossible to hear her when she changed," she added, asserting that such control was a sign of instrumental mastery.

"(Bruch's concerto) is one of the hardest concertos written for the violin," Lowne continued. "She pulled out all the stops for it."

Noval's conductor, Dr. David Fetler, was equally impressed by his star musician's work. "I think she is a very gifted young lady," Fetler said. "She has wonderful intonation, bow control and sensitivity, and lots of different shadings."

Noval explained that the beauty she creates on the strings is rooted in her contemplation of the composer's work. "I just try to think about the composer and what he was thinking when he was writing it," she said.

Sister Mary Aloise Raha, SSND former Holy Family teacher, at 87

Sister Mary Aloise Raha, SSND, who taught at Holy Family School in Rochester from 1961-67, died Oct. 25, 1989, in Lourdes Health Care Center, Wilton, Conn. She was 87.

Born in New York City on Dec. 25, 1901, Sister Aloise entered the School Sisters of Notre Dame from Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish in New York City. She was a professed member of the order for 67 years.

Sister Aloise served at many schools throughout the Northeast as an elementary and high school teacher, as well as a principal and school supervisor.

She spent her early teaching days at schools in New York City, Brooklyn and New Jersey. After one year at Mission High School in Roxbury, Mass., Sister

Aloise was assigned to Holy Family in 1961. She remained at the Rochester parish until 1967, when she moved to St. Mary's School, East Islip, Long Island.

After retiring from teaching in 1975, Sister Aloise moved from St. Joseph's School in New York City to the SSND Motherhouse in Wilton.
