Saints, Knights, Crusaders off to fast starts

Finger Lakes West opponents must be wondering if "Saints" is a misnomer for the boys from DeSales.

DeSales has jumped out to a 3-0 record by soundly trouncing its opponents, averaging 79 points per game with a defense that has allowed a mere 45 points per game.

If they keep it up, maybe they should be tagged the "Magnificent Seven."

The Saints, who have just seven players on the varsity, mauled visiting Gananda (1-1) 103-42 on December 6. Every De-Sales player scored in double figures, led by Chris Ike's 24 points. Eddie Marsteiner contributed 17 points, and Jeff Taney netted 16. Center Robert McFadden hauled in 17 boards to complement his 14 points.

Host Naples looked as if they were ready to give the Saints a game on Dec. 8. De-Sales was clinging to a 28-24 lead at the half, but then exploded in the second half before cruising to a 73-44 victory.

Marsteiner took scoring honors this time, popping in two three-pointers on his way to 20 points. McFadden added 16 points.

The Saints were scheduled to host Dundee (1-2) on Dec. 13.

Nine ND players named Section IV grid all-stars

The Notre Dame football team, which fell to Chenango Valley in the Section VI Bowl 2 game, placed nine players on the Section IV Division IV all-star team — the largest number of all-stars from any one team.

Mike Bennett, a running back and defensive back who earned Most Valuable Player honors in the bowl game, topped the Crusader contingent. Joining him on the team were: Brian Sheehan, Geoff Woodworth, Lee Heyward, Andy Minch, Travis Apgar, Anthony Wisniewski and Blake Pierce. beating host Penfield 72-52 on Friday, Dec. 8.

Jay Moore led McQuaid with 12 points, and Kevin Brown added 11.

Marshall was scheduled to host McQuaid on Dec. 12.

Aquinas (1-1, 2-1) suffered an 86-69 loss at the hands of host Wilson (2-0, 4-0) on Dec. 5. After falling behind 42-27 at the half, the Little Irish battled back to within three points in the third quarter.

But that was as close as Aquinas could get, as Wilson extended the lead to 54-47 at the end of the quarter, and outscored the Little Irish 32-22 in the fourth quarter.

Meanwhile, the Crusaders — who had suffered a spell of poor shooting in the first half — began to connect after the intermission. Brian Sheehan pumped in 18 of his game-high 28 points in the second half to lead the rally.

Notre Dame center Rick Shaw collected 13 points and 15 rebounds.

At least one player already has plenty of experience. Junior point guard Danielle Boncaro returns after making the allconference team last year.


The team will also enjoy the return of
