
Diocesah boys' basketball teams ended 1989 on a high note, winning three holiday tournament titles.

McQuaid (9-0) entered the Brockport Tournament with several strikes against it.


Jason McKinney, the Knights' 6-10 center, was battling the flu, and point guard Kevin Brown was nursing an ankle

The Little Irish had to come from behind to beat the Chiefs 63-58 in the opening round of the Hilton Tournament on Dec. 28.


Trailing 37-30 at the half, Aquinas took the lead with just five minutes left in the fourth quarter.
