BK, McQuaid lacrosse aim at improving

ROCHESTER — If numbers are any indication, the lacrosse programs at Bishop Kearney and McQuaid Jesuit high schools should be rousing successes this spring.

Sixty-five players went out for the varsity and jayvee teams at Kearney, while 56 tried out at McQuaid.

Both teams will also have new faces at head coach. Tom Coons, who played at Nazareth College after starring at Rush-Henrietta High School, replaces Jim Burns at Kearney.

The new coach at McQuaid Jesuit is Tony Levin. After playing on a sectional champion at Rush-Henrietta Sperry, Levin moved on to Cortland State. An assistant lacrosse coach at Cardinal Mooney last spring, Levin takes over for former McQuaid coach Mike Schepis.

Coons inherits a Kearney team that finished 9-8 last season after losing to Penn Yan in the Class B sectional playoffs. The Kings qualified for the sectionals for the first time ever last year, and Coons is looking forward to guiding them to the postseason again.

Kearney lost several key players to graduation, including goalie Mark Hall, defenseman Craig Chodak, and the team's second-leading scorer, Steve (Beaver) Smith. The ex-Kearney midfielder recorded 40 goals and 22 assists last year.

The team's leading scorer last spring, attacker Jon Hand (35 goals, 35 assists during the regular season), will be back for his senior season. Joining him at attack will be Jim Ingrick (15 goals) and Greg Phillips.

John Werner — who saw extensive ac-

tion in goal last season — will return to the crease this year. He will play behind a defensive unit Coons believes may be the team's strong point.

Offensively, Coons will use a "run-andgun" style similar to the one he played at Nazareth College. The Kings' coach said the new offense should generate more goals this season, and may surprise some teams that are used to the more traditional offense displayed by Kearney in previous

Coons said the new offense has shown promisé in pre-season scrimmages against Webster and Rush Henrietta, "but it takes games before you can tell what kind of team you'll have.'
